ALGEBRA SKILLS

REGISTER ONLINE OR WITH A REGISTRATION FORM FROM YOUR TEACHER: Algebra Skills is designed to work on remedial algebra skills. Students will be able to earn ½ credit of math elective credit for completion of the course. Preference will be given to students who struggled to complete Algebra 1 (students who do not pass 2nd semester Algebra 1 may be eligible for Geometry with the completion of Algebra Skills). Students who struggled with Pre-Algebra or Geometry will be welcome if room is available in the class.

To earn credit for Algebra Skills, students will need to complete six workbooks with unit tests and pass a final exam. Students must also have no more than 5 unexcused absences (leaving/arriving more than 1 hour late/early is equivalent to 1 unexcused absence).
