3. Fighting/Threats (9%)

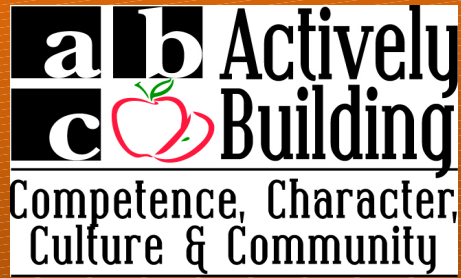

Oregon AODA Policy prohibits:

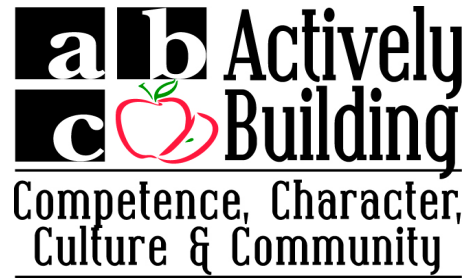
1. The manufacture distribution, solicitation, possession, use or consumption of drugs or intoxicants;
2. The possession of drug-related paraphernalia or other intoxicant containers; or
3. Being under the influence of a drug or other intoxicant.



Oregon School District

Oregon Weapons policy prohibits:

1. Possession of a weapon (18 USC Sec. 921); or
2. Possession of any object that by its design and/or use can cause bodily injury or property damage.



Oregon School District

Oregon policy prohibits any conduct which endangers a person or property, including threats to the health or safety of a person or a threat to damage property

Expulsion Process:

1. Weapons – referral to Board expulsion process
2. Bad Conduct – Administrative discretion

Expulsion Process – AODA

- First offense:
 - a. Pre-Expulsion meeting with administration, student and parent;
 - b. Five-day suspension, which can be reduced by AODA assessment; and
 - c. Behavioral plan/contract

Expulsion Process – AODA

4. Second offense:

- a. Pre-Expulsion meeting with administration, student and parent;
- b. Referral for expulsion (w/suspension);
- c. Board expulsion and terms for early reinstatement



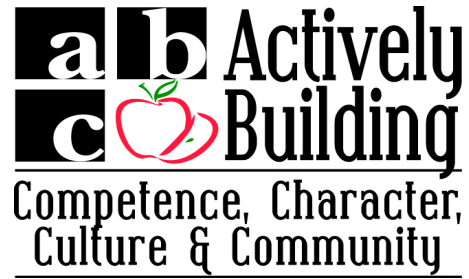

3. We get to know each other in a different setting.

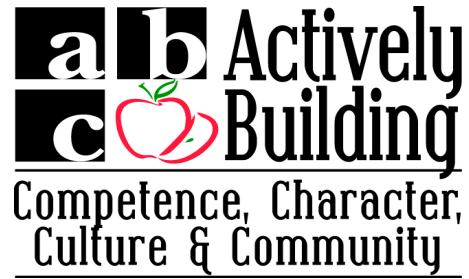

1. Risk Seeking
2. School not relevant
3. Parents/Home life
4. Peer groups
5. ADD/medication issues
6. Mental health issues
7. Classroom difficulties
