
### **PBIS** Update

### Snacks

Please send your child with a snack each day, if your family is able. Consult the classroom teacher for specific routines regarding snacks. PVE will provide them for hungry kids in need.

### Attendance Line — 608.835.4200, Option 1

If your child is absent from school for any reason, it is imperative that you call the attendance line (835.4200, Option 1) BEFORE 8:00 a.m.

Please leave a clearly spoken message with your name, your child's name, and the reason for the absence. Last minute calls should come directly to the office (835.4200, Option 0). Please do not phone or email office or teaching staff directly as those messages may not be received by the person verifying attendance.

### **Important Reminders**

- If you need to pick up your child during the school day for an appointment, please call the attendance line and send a note in the morning to the homeroom teacher, as well.
- Please make all after school plans with your children prior to the beginning of the school day. Please don't ask us to relay messages to students for a change in plans or to deliver dropped off items, unless there is an emergency, as it can cause confusion and it is a disruption to the classroom and learning environment. If you have a change from the regular routine, please send a note in the morning for the teacher and inform bus drivers and childcare providers, too.
- Children should arrive at school no earlier than 7:35 a.m. Student supervision is not available before then. The school day runs from 7:50 a.m. until 2:50 p.m. Children should arrive in time to be ready for class to begin at 7:50. Students leaving before 2:50, will have their attendance marked accordingly.
- The school day ends at 2:50. Children not riding the bus or walking/biking home, must be picked up at that time.
- We ask that pets not be brought on school grounds.

#### Weather Concerns

With the advent of cooler weather, inclement weather, and unsafe driving conditions, it does become necessary at times to start school late, dismiss early, or not be in session at all. The Oregon School District will communicate school cancellations, delays, or early releases in the following ways:

### **Cancellations and Late Starts**

If school will be delayed or closed for the day, the District will make every effort to make the decision by 5:30-6:00 a.m. (the normal timeframe for closures). We understand that many families prefer to make plans for school closures as far in advance as possible; however, weather patterns are not always predictable and weather-related impacts for schools are not often clear until early morning hours on the day of the potential closure. We thank you for your understanding on these days of potential weather-related closures.

At all times and in all cases, families make the final decision on attendance at school on inclement weather days. If no school delay or cancellation is issued and you believe the conditions (e.g., road conditions, temperature) are not appropriate for your student, you are free to keep your student home and the absence will be excused. If you choose to keep your student home, please call the PVE Attendance Line to report the absence. If an announcement is made stating that school is to start late, bus drivers will make arrangements to pick up students one or two hours later than their usual pick up time (ex: with a one hour delay, the bus will pick up students one hour after their usual time, a two hour delay will be two hours after their usual pick up time).

Caregivers, please make sure that you have turned in your early closing plan that was sent home earlier this year, in case an early dismissal is called. Also, inform your child of the plans, if you haven't already done so.



### What to Do If I Get Stuck while Reading:




- Look Closely at the Word

### **Building Time Spent Reading**

Building reading stamina is an important skill for readers to develop. Here are some tips for working on reading stamina at home:

- Set aside a regular time for reading each day.
- Help your child find books they enjoy and are interested in.
- Eliminate distractions during reading time.
- Read together as a family. Take turns reading pages aloud.
- Keep it fun: Try audiobooks, area library visits, reading to your pet or someone special over the phone or Facetime
- Set small goals and track progress.

Developing reading stamina takes time and consistency. But it's a worthwhile effort that will serve students well as they develop into proficient readers.

### **ORCHARDS Study**

If your student is experiencing respiratory symptoms, your family may be eligible to participate in the UW Oregon Child Absenteeism due to Respiratory Disease Study (ORCHARDS). This study looks at household transmission of COVID-19, Influenza and other respiratory viruses. If eligible, research staff will drop off study materials outside of your home for completing three nasal swab collections over a two week period. Since this is a research study, COVID-19 results may not be received as quickly as they would be at general testing sites. Your family will receive a \$50 gift card for participating in this study. ### Dress for the Cold Weather

The cold weather has arrived. Please dress your children appropriately for outside play. We all go

outside for fresh air and fun unless the temperature is below zero. Children need to have a winter coat, mittens, hat, snow pants, and boots at school each day. When there is snow, children play only on the blacktop unless they are wearing



snow pants and boots. **Please label all winter gear with your child's name** and be sure to check the lost and found bins if you're missing items.
