What's New?

Big changes are happening at Forest Edge Elementary School! Zinc panels are starting to be installed on the exterior of the school to cover up the blue weatherproofing. Geothermal drillers are close to completing the bores, and will soon begin piping tie-ins. Sage glass has also begun to fill in the window openings and brighten up the school. The solar installation team arrived Monday, and will begin installing the solar panels to allow the school to produce its own power!

On the 2nd level, flooring in the classrooms is finished. The ceramic tile in the bathrooms is also nearing completion. Soon lockers for grades four through six will be added. Flooring contractors have begun laying carpet in the 1st floor classrooms on the North West corner of the building. Ceiling tile will soon be dropped in the south rooms. Drywall is finishing up in the cafeteria, and then the ceiling will be painted. The stairwells are being painted with their first coat, and the frames and doors to the courtyards are set to allow access into the center areas.
