Advanced Speech Mrs. Davies & Mr. Ducett

A. **GOALS:**

In this class each student will be allowed to

- 1. explore and express ideas through daily speaking;
- 2. feel comfortable sharing ideas, responses, and oral work of classmates;
- 3. become a more creative and effective speaker;
- 4. become a skilled editor and constructive critic of oral work;
- 5. become a more engaged and thoughtful reader of prose and poetry, fiction, and nonfiction;
- 6. learn the techniques of public speaking;
- 7. become a more critical listener;
- 8. identify and work toward one's personal goals as a student of speech; and
- 9. grow as a scholar, as an oral language artist, and as a human being.

B. **EXPECTATIONS**:

- 1. There are very specific guidelines for behavior in this course. In order for us to accomplish our goals, we all need to contribute to a classroom environment that is comfortable and respectful and encourages people to participate and to excel. No verbal or physical abuse will be tolerated. The OHS Harassment Policy will be strictly enforced. Students who abide by these guidelines will be successful in this room; however, those who choose to disregard these guidelines will be dealt with in an appropriate manner that could result in a visit to the ALAC room, and /or a call to parents/guardians.
- 2. Students will be in their assigned seats and will be prepared for instruction when the bell rings. Students who disregard this will be marked tardy. Three unexcused tardies will result in an unexcused absence and will affect RAP.
- 3. **Plagiarism and cheating will not be tolerated in any form**. Cheating and/or copying work from another student or another source is not acceptable and may result in a zero for the assignment, notification of parents/guardians, and notification of the administration at the discretion of the instructor.
- 4. Students are expected to report to class every day with the proper materials. Students will need to bring the following materials daily: loose-leaf paper, a three-ring binder, a pencil, and a great attitude.
- 5. Students are responsible for obtaining the assignments and handouts missed during an absence. Do not be absent on the day you are assigned to deliver a speech. If this does happen and the absence is due to an emergency/illness (i.e. excused), you will be required to deliver the speech or turn in the assignment the day you return. If you are not excused, the grade for the missed speech/assignment may be a zero. Please communicate with your teacher concerning upcoming absences, as well as circumstances beyond your control.
- 6. **Electronic devices of any kind are not allowed in the classroom**. If they are seen, they will be taken from the student and may be picked up in the classroom or in the office at the end of the day. **Be respectful!**

C. RESPONISBILITY and ATTITUDE PROGRAM:
