# **World Geography & Global Issues**

Course: Students will be engage, study, analyze, and interpret specific regions of the world that generate global issues such as conflict, poverty, slavery, and economic/political influence impacting the rest of the world. Each region review will also include the basics of history and geographic features that make up the area studied.

### Units

- 1. Basic Outlines and Concepts of the World eg. maps/locations/terminology
- 2. Mexico and its challenges in North America
- 3. Columbia/Brazil and the internal impact on other countries
- 4. Africa: focusing on the challenges including Sierre Leonne/Rwanda/Sudan
- 5. Europe: Impact of the New World Set Up., Euro; EU; Balkan War (Bosina)
- 6. Hot topics: Overpopulation, Poverty, Nuclear Challenges/Slavery, Child Soldiers
